- Expand Wi-Fi connectivity and upgrade the digital library.
- Implement Learning Management Systems (LMS) for e-learning.
- Provide MOOCs, virtual labs, and faculty training for digital teaching.

2. ICT-Enabled Governance

- Develop automated student records, online admissions, and digital payments.
- Maintain an updated college website with academic resources.

3. Digital Skill Development

- Conduct ICT workshops and introduce digital literacy courses.
- Collaborate for certified ICT training programs.
